

Cheerleader Tryout Agreement

Please read with your parents, sign, and turn into Sarah Nelson before tryouts begin. If this is not turned in, you may not tryout. Sorry, no exceptions.

1. During all days of tryouts, please wear black, gold, or white.
2. The cost of being a cheerleader can be higher than other activities. Please be prepared to pay \$300-\$400 dollars for the year. This is important because the school cannot cover these fees. Fees will go to shoes, poms, briefs, etc.
3. Camp will be held end of July and mandatory practices will begin the first week of fall sports.
4. Cheerleaders may never let a job get in the way of games and practices. This has been a big issue in the past and even though a schedule is put out, it can change. Cheerleading is a 5-day a week commitment during the season.
5. **All those who make the Varsity squad will also be the Competition squad.** This means there will be some Saturdays taken for competition. We will try and do at least 3 competitions this year starting in December, so we will learn our routine right away.
6. Cheerleading has become a very physical activity. All cheerleaders who make a squad must be physically able to participate in Stunting. If you feel they may not be able to do this, be sure to let their doctor know so they do not clear them for the activity.

These are just a few things that we think the parents should be aware of before tryouts. There is a separate set of rules that the cheerleader and parent will sign after they make a squad.
