Registering keeps you eligible for good jobs, driver's license renewal in most states, and job training. Plus, if you are an immigrant and a guy, you can never get citizenship if you don't register. You can register at the nearest US Post Office, or go on line. It only takes a few minutes and it is the LAW!
