Eagle bowlers return from grueling competition on Thursday and Friday with 2nd Place at the State tournament for the 2nd year in a row. Thursday saw the team bowling in six games to determine individual awards. Lizzie Deloria closed 7 of her 15 frames in regular play. Erica Morley made a solid contribution with her five highest games being 167, 188 on a double whammy, 166, 171 with a turkey and a whammy for 189. Jazzie Martin's highest scores were 160, 181 on a double whammy and 173 on a double whammy. Rin Birchfield contributed 147, 164 on a double whammy and had a personal best with a 2 X 4 (eight in a row) for 225. She started the next game with two strikes as well giving her 10 strikes in a row. Halie Martin placed 4th out of 72 bowlers with a total score of 1120. She turkeyed for 172, had a clean sweep for 208, a turkey and a clean sweep for 213, 182, a whammy for 194, and a whammy for 151. Regan Lorey placed 2nd with 1234. She opened with tournament high 268 via a 2 X 4 and added 225 via hambone, 172, 164, 185 and a double whammy and turkey for 210. In her four years at Bay she has placed in the top 5 at the state tournament all four years.

The Eagles were in 1st place after three games and fell to third after six, 36 pins behind Wilson in 2nd. Setting the scene for the Baker battle on Saturday. The combination of thursday and Friday

scores would determine the team awards. With a total team effort by Erica, Jazzie, Rin, Halie, Reagan, Lizzie and Alexis Sheldon the Eagles never gave up and clawed their way into 2nd Place. A Baker game has 5 bowlers each bowling 2 frames for a total team score. They only needed the first 5 to catch Wilson and kept the hammer down to defeat them by 176 to claim their 2nd place. High baker scores were 191, 194, 188, 202, 182, 202 and the final game was 213 to seal the deal. Make sure to high five these girls when you see them in the hallway or class. It is a major accomplishment to earn three bids to state in three years and even bigger to earn back-to-back 2nd places. "They dared to be great, stood strong alone and were unstoppable together!"

Congratulations to Allison Blaine, Angel Catillo and Angel Terry for earning 1st place at the District tournament for wrestling this past weekend, and Malek Mabrouk and Alejandro Alvarez for earning 4th place. As a sophomore, Allison earned her second district title going 3-0 in the tournament with all wins by pin, and continues to have a perfect record for the season and continues to work for her first State title. Angel Catillo earned his first district title and also went 3-0 in the tournament with 3 pins. In the finals, Angel avenged an early season loss to a Kelso wrestler by pinning him in the second period. Senior and first year wrestler, Angel Terry earned his first district title in his first year and day of wrestling!! Angel went 3-0 with 2 pins and knocking off the #1 seed in the semi-finals. All 3 wrestlers will be moving on the Regional tournament this weekend and will need to earn a top 4 placing to make it to State!
