Are you interested in summer school through Cascadia Tech Academy? The Cascadia Tech summer school program is available to students who have completed 9th, 10th & 11th grades.

Courses assist student in career exploration and are available in subjects like car maintenance, carpentry, fashion, dental careers and more. Students can earn .5 elective credits for successful completion and some classes offer academic credit. There is no cost for summer school, except some classes may have a small lab fee. Courses will run from June 26 - July 18 from 8 a.m. - 3 p.m. at the Cascadia Tech campus. Students will need to provide their own transportation and attendance is very important. Online
