Students, if you are currently working at a job right now, or will soon have one, see Mr. Griffiths in room 318 so you can get high school credit for working at your job. Attention all Hudson's Bay males who are 18 or about to turn 18: You must, by federal law, register with Selective Service within one month of your 18 birthday. Registering keeps you eligible for good jobs, driver's license renewal in most states, and job training. Plus, if you are an immigrant and a guy, you can never get citizenship if you don't register. You can register at the nearest US Post Office, or go on line. It only takes a few minutes and it is the LAW!

As the weather gets more sunny and warmer, it is a good time for a reminder regarding HBHS's dress code expectations. Please remember the following as you "dress for your school day at Bay":

--all shirts must cover your midriff and your undergarments--so, no bare midriffs and no undergarments should be seen
--shorts and skirts MUST be the appropriate length--so, shorts and skirts that are shorter than the wearer's fingertips (when arms hanging down) should not be worn to school

--no wearing sunglasses inside the school building
--shirts should not have lewd, sexual, weapon, drug, tobacco, or violent messages.

If you are unsure about any of these expectations, please check with HBHS staff or administration.

Students, please remember, if you are wearing clothes that do not meet the above criteria you will be asked to change into the appropriate clothing. If you do not want to be asked to change---please follow the expectations listed above.
