Students, if you are currently working at a job right now, or will soon have one, see Mr. Griffiths in room 318 so you can get high school credit for working at your job. You can get up to two (2) full credits each school year for the hours you work at your job. You can use the credit to take the place of any electives or occupational credits that you need.

On Wednesday, October 11 2017, all Vancouver Public School (VPS) high schools will administer the PSAT/NMSQT free of charge to all 10th grade and qualifying 11th grade students. The PSAT/NMSQT will be administered on campus during the regular school day. Students are encouraged to take the PSAT/NMSQT. Scores can help students develop a clear picture of themselves and their readiness for career/college. Having said this, not all

students' High School and Beyond Plans include the PSAT/NMSQT. Families may choose to have their student(s) opt out of the PSAT/NMSQT. Students who have opted out of the PSAT/NMSQT will be given a school-based alternative. To opt out of the PSAT students need to have their parents complete the Google form on HBHS webpage. Students wanting a paper copy of the opt-out form can obtain a copy in the security office. All opt out forms must be submitted by 9/11/2017. The PSAT/NMSQT is the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. Students use the PSAT as practice for the SAT or ACT. The SAT and ACT are standardized admission tests widely used for college admissions in the United States. Students' PSAT score is an important guidepost on their career/college readiness journey. They show what they're doing well, and what they should work on to get ready for the SAT/ACT—and for college. The PSAT won't count towards students' college admissions applications, but it is the qualifying test for the National Merit Scholarship for 11th-grade students.

Students, please remember that hanging out in the 100 through 500 hallways is not permitted during lunches. You can be in the Commons, Courtyard and the hallways around the Counseling Center.

Attention all Hudson's Bay males who are 18 or about to turn 18: You must, by federal law, register with Selective Service within one month of your 18 birthday. Registering keeps you eligible for good jobs, driver's license renewal in most states, and job training. Plus, if you are an immigrant and a guy, you can never get citizenship if you don't register. You can register at the nearest US Post Office, or go on line. It only takes a few minutes and it is the LAW!
